

# EHNAC Program Selection Guide

<i>If you...</i>	<i>...then you may apply for:</i>
...define your organization as an Accountable Care Organization, characterized by a payment and care delivery model that seeks to tie provider reimbursements to quality metrics and reductions in the total cost of care for an assigned population of patients	<b>ACOAP</b> <i>Accountable Care Organization Accreditation Program</i>
...use a cloud service provider (CSP) for your production operations or for storing or processing PHI and if you are already accredited for or are seeking to become a candidate of at least one other EHNAC-accreditation program	<b>CEAP</b> <i>Cloud Enabled Accreditation Program</i> <b>NOTE: CEAP is always a Multiple Program, where CEAP is the secondary accreditation program. There is always an additional Site Visit day associated with CEAP accreditation. Interested organizations who are not currently accredited by EHNAC may apply, but must also apply and ultimately achieve accreditation for another primary EHNAC accreditation program in addition to CEAP.</b>
...are a Qualified Clinical Data Registry (QCDR), provide a CMS qualified Physician Quality Reporting System (PQRS), collect medical data, clinical data, and/or statistics from providers for the purpose of patient and disease tracking to foster improvement in the quality of care furnished to patients and/or for reporting to CMS or other entities on behalf of healthcare providers	<b>DRAP</b> <i>Data Registry Accreditation Program</i>
...are a health information “trusted agent” service provider (such as an EHR service provider) and act as a Health Information Service Provider (HISP), a Certification Authority (CA), and/or a Registration Authority (RA)	<b>DTAAP-HISP</b> <i>Direct Trusted Agent Accreditation Program</i>
...are an organization that issues digital certificates in a public key infrastructure environment and are a Certification Authority (CA)	<b>DTAAP-CA</b> <i>Direct Trusted Agent Accreditation Program</i>
...are a Registration Authority (RA) in a network that verifies user requests for a <a href="#">digital certificate</a> and tells the certificate authority ( <a href="#">CA</a> ) to issue it. RAs are part of a public key infrastructure ( <a href="#">PKI</a> ), a networked system that enables companies and users to exchange information and money safely and securely.	<b>DTAAP-RA</b> <i>Direct Trusted Agent Accreditation Program</i>
...are a network or exchange that enables prescribers, payers and pharmacists to communicate electronically through the processing of electronic prescriptions or other prescription-related transactions	<b>ePAP-EHN</b> <i>ePrescribing Accreditation Program</i>
...are a pharmacy application vendor who would like to have your products certified to be able to process controlled substance prescriptions	<b>EPCSCP-Pharmacy</b> <i>e-Prescribing of Controlled Substances Certification Program for Pharmacy Applications</i>
...are a prescriber application vendor who would like to have your products certified to be able to process controlled substance prescriptions	<b>EPCSCP-Prescribing</b> <i>e-Prescribing of Controlled Substances Certification Program for Prescribing Applications</i>

...are a financial services organization that also provides the capabilities of an Electronic Healthcare Network	<b>FSAP-EHN</b> <i>Financial Services Accreditation Program - Electronic Health Network</i>
...are a financial services organization that provides lockbox services that include the processing of transactions containing Protected Health Information (PHI)	<b>FSAP-Lockbox</b> <i>Financial Services Accreditation Program - Lockbox</i>
...consider your organization to be a Health Information Exchange (HIE) or Health Information Organization (HIO), and you enable the mobilization/exchange of healthcare information electronically across organizations within a region or community, including disparate healthcare information systems, while maintaining the meaning of the information exchanged	<b>HIEAP</b> <i>Health Information Exchange Accreditation Program</i>
... provide the services of an Electronic Healthcare Network including Batch, Real-time and/or VAN services while being neither a Payer nor a Financial organization	<b>HNAP-EHN</b> <i>Healthcare Network Accreditation Program - Electronic Health Network</i>
...provide medical claim coding, submission, follow-up and related services on behalf of one or more medical providers	<b>HNAP-Medical Biller</b> <i>Healthcare Network Accreditation Program - Medical Biller</i>
...are a healthcare insurance payer	<b>HNAP-Payer</b> <i>Healthcare Network Accreditation Program - Payer</i>
...are a state-licensed organization that adjudicates claims and provides administrative services on behalf of another organization's self-funded benefit plan	<b>HNAP-TPA</b> <b>Healthcare Network Accreditation Program - Third Party Administrator</b>
...offer one or more hosted electronic health record solutions to multiple health care providers, and offer management services to health care providers that enable them to achieve meaningful use	<b>MSOAP</b> <i>Management Service Organization Accreditation Program</i>
...provide outsourced technology solutions to Accountable Care Organizations in support of their goal of providing a payment and care delivery model that seeks to tie provider reimbursements to quality metrics and reductions in the total cost of care for an assigned population of patients	<b>OSAP-ACO</b> <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Accountable Care Organizations</i>
...provide outsourced call center or customer support services where Protected Health Information (PHI) is viewed or otherwise accessed on behalf of Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA	<b>OSAP-Call Center</b> <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Call Center Operations</i>
...provide outsourced data center facilities in which Protected Health Information (PHI) is processed by Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA	<b>OSAP-Data Center</b> <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Data Center facilities and Services</i>
...provide outsourced disaster recovery facilities and/or services for organizations that handle Protected Health Information (PHI) and which are Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA	<b>OSAP-Disaster Recovery</b> <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Disaster Recovery Facilities and Services</i>

<p>...provide outsourced clinical health information exchange technology to HIEs, enabling them to deliver effective solutions within their defined communities</p>	<p><b>OSAP-HIE</b>  <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Health Information Exchange</i></p>
<p>...provide outsourced media storage services in which Protected Health Information (PHI) stored for Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA</p>	<p><b>OSAP-Media Storage</b>  <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Media Storage Facilities and Services</i></p>
<p>...provide outsourced system administration and/or network administration services for organizations that handle Protected Health Information (PHI) and which are Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA</p>	<p><b>OSAP-Network Administrator</b>  <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Systems and Network Administration Services</i></p>
<p>...provide outsourced printing services where Protected Health Information (PHI) is handled on behalf of Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA</p>	<p><b>OSAP-Printing</b>  <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Printing Service Operations</i></p>
<p>...provide outsourced product development services that include the viewing and/or handling of Protected Health Information (PHI) on behalf of Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA</p>	<p><b>OSAP-Product Development</b>  <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Product Development</i></p>
<p>...provide outsourced scanning services where Protected Health Information (PHI) is handled on behalf of Covered Entities or Business Associates as defined by HIPAA</p>	<p><b>OSAP-Scanning</b>  <i>Outsourced Services Accreditation Program for Scanning Service Operations</i></p>
<p>...provide Practice Management System solutions via software or through host-based services such as SaaS or Client-server technology.</p>	<p><b>PMSAP</b>  <i>Practice Management System Accreditation Program</i></p>
